

The **University of A Coruña** is a public university, established in 1989 and located in the cities of A Coruña and Ferrol, Galicia (North West of Spain).










Galicia – Spain



- Near 3 million people live in Galicia, mainly in the coastal area. The cities of A Coruña and Vigo are the two most populous cities.
- The capital, Santiago de Compostela, is the end of the Way of Saint James, a historical European route of pilgrimage and communication of Culture that started in the Medieval Age.
- The two official languages are Spanish and Galician, a Romance language similar to Portuguese.

- The degree programme consists of four 1 year courses (each lasting 8 months, from October to June, and worth 9 credits), making a total of 36 credits.
- Students receive 3 or 4
 sessions per week (i.e.
 lectures, seminars, skills
 workshops, etc.).










- Each learner studies two compulsory subjects per year plus one they choose.
- The subjets belong to the following areas:
 - Humanities and Social Sciences.
 - Science and Technology
 - Health Sciences








After four years students graduate with the *Título de Graduado Senior pola Universidade da Coruña* [Senior University Degree]. This is a personal development award and not a professional qualification.

















Gender of learners

- It has continued without interruption until the present academic year 2015-2016. During this time, the Senior University has participated mainly in Learning Partnerships.












Objectives:

 - Result: a practice-oriented and multicultural guide for the establishment of services for elderly people adapted to the national realities.






