The classes are all practical and are handicraft activities, such as:


- 1) Floral Arts

Experience and best practice

Why Are Manual Skills Important For The Elderly?

- For them to have an active ageing
- 2) To stimulate their creativity
- 3) So they don't lose or stimulate fine motor skills...

Experience and best practice

What are my personal experiences of manual skills for elders?

- 1) A great deal of knowledge sharing on both sides.
- 2) I learnt how to listen to the students and understand what can be a challenge for them, so that it does not become a problem, so that the goal in the end is always surprising.
- 3) Most of the time I throw high goals, but with the support of all those involved the Final work most of the time ends up exceeding my expectations!!!!

What are my recommendations for manual skills lectors for the elderly?

- 1) In my opinion, we must be demanding with the students and with us, so that the work becomes appealing.
- I like to create new things all the time and I think that's the only way I can keep students for 11 years.
- 3) It's also important to do research and update myself, and whenever possible to do some training.













Experience and best practice

What are my recommendations for elderly in manual skills?

- 1) At the beginning of the school year, make a kind of survey to understand the expectations of students.
- 2) In all the works we start, we always have a "plan B" to be able to appeal if necessary.
- 3) Do some work, stimulation/motivation games, even if they are not related to the subject, but are undoubtedly a "key" to success.

It is a privilege to be part of this project and to see it grow, to see the brilliant result it gives, in helping for an aging of excellence, an "Active Aging".






























































































